If a student requests a transcript it is usually fulfilled within 2 business days. If a student has a letter of recommendation from a community member, Mrs. Winters can add it to your student's Naviance account.

Financial Aid Information

FASFA opened on October 1st. If you need assistance please see Mrs. Winters in the counseling office or Simone Sharma from the Illinois Student Assistance Committee (ISAC) who is available in the counseling office every Tuesday from 10 AM to 2PM. We encourage all of our students to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible. Financial aid is not only accepted by colleges and universities but also available at community colleges and trade schools.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn 20 credits from the approved list of courses and students must meet the following minimum requirements:

Mathematics	3.0 credits
Science	2.0 credits
Social Studies Electives	1.5 credits
United States History	1.0 credit
Civics	0.5 credit
Econ/Consumer Ed	0.5 credit
Physical Education	2.0 credits
Fine Arts/World Language/Career and	
Technical Education	2.0 credits

Students must also pass the Constitution Test and take one semester of Health.

College Application Check List

Make sure you check each college or university's requirements. Here are some of the common requests:

- ⇒ Essay/Personal Statement
- ⇒ Letters of Recommendation
- ⇒ Transcript Requested via Naviance
- ⇒ SAT/ACT scores (if official are needed must be sent by test provider, waivers are available)
- ⇒ Application fee waiver (sent with transcript or via Common App)

The Illinois State Scholar program is awarded to high school seniors based on ACT or SAT test scores and the sixth semester class size and unweighted class rank and Grade Point Average (GPA).

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
